

Member Agency Grant Program

Program Goals

To provide grants to SDCP member agencies to support their climate action goals and initiatives such as projects or programs that promote clean energy, reduce carbon emissions, support climate equity, and advance local economic development


















Program Timing





Program Overview

- SDCP member agencies will be eligible to apply for a noncompetitive \$50,000 grant
- Grant funding will be provided directly to member agencies or via services to implement a project that helps them achieve their climate action goals

Program Goals

To provide grants to community-based organizations and nonprofits that support local clean energy projects and programs that provide economic, environmental, health, and community benefits





FY 2022-23 Program Timing





Program Administration

- Staff are beginning to plan for the next program cycle now that the inaugural program is underway
- In August 2023, SDCP issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) to establish program administration support for the next three program years
- San Diego Foundation was selected







FY 2023-24 Program Details

- Next grant cycle anticipated to open in Q1 2024
- Board-approved program budget: \$500,000
 - Staff aim to increase the program budget by securing additional funding sources with the help of the program administrator



FY 2023-24 Program Planning

- Feedback expected to be incorporated into the next grant cycle:
 - Increase program promotion
 - Open program earlier in calendar year
 - Allow time to ask grantees questions during evaluation period
 - Identify targets for funding grassroots vs established organizations



Next Steps

Staff will begin developing the program guidelines with San Diego
Foundation in Q4 2023 and will bring back an update prior to opening the
next grant cycle
