

San Diego Community Power 2026 All Source RFO Questions and Answers

San Diego Community Power received the following questions by the deadline stipulated in the request for offers (RFO).

Is there a maximum bid size?

Yes, Community Power requests that project sizes be capped at 200MW.

Is there a target amount of MW SDCP is trying to procure via this RFO?

No, Community Power is not disclosing a targeted procurement volume at this time. Ultimate procurement decisions will take into account factors such as portfolio needs, project attributes, pricing, and overall value to Community Power.

Is SDCP interested in evaluating a TB4 + RA settlement structure on a LLT storage resource (as opposed to a TB8 on an 8-hr battery)?

Yes, Community Power is interested in evaluating a TB4 + RA structure on an LLT storage resource. Please select the TB4 settlement structure in the offer form and update the technology accordingly. Please flag any missing details in the offer form, and in the project narrative.

Will SDCP consider a TB4 settlement structure as the equivalent to “High (A)” since there is no energy settlement directly at the node?

No, Community Power will not automatically consider a TB4 settlement structure as the equivalent to a “High (A)” as the project’s proposed contract price will be analyzed against TB4 price forecasts and graded accordingly.

Will SDCP post TB4 energy settlement structure language?

Following is an excerpt of Community Power’s presumed settlement structure:

For each Month of the Delivery Period, the “Monthly Capacity Payment” shall be equal to (a) - (b), where:

“(a)” is (i) the Contract Price, multiplied by (ii) the Contract Quantity for such Month, multiplied by (iii) 1,000, rounded to the nearest penny (i.e., two decimal places).

“(b)” is the sum across each Day in the applicable Month of the following: the product of (i) the Contract Quantity for such Day, multiplied by (ii) the Daily Energy Settlement Rate for such Day (the “Monthly Energy Settlement Amount”). In no event may the Monthly Energy Settlement Amount be less than zero.

The “Daily Energy Settlement Rate” shall equal (1) the sum of the highest priced four (4) hours at the Settlement Point in the Day-Ahead Market for such Day, minus (2) the sum of the lowest priced hours at the Settlement Point in the Day-Ahead Market for such Day;

Is San Diego Community Power evaluating Cluster 16 offers for point allocation?

Yes, Community Power is evaluating Cluster 16 offers for commercial interest point allocations through a separate Request for Information process, currently live on the Community Power Solicitation website. Cluster 16 projects are not eligible for the 2026 All Source Request for Offers.

SDCP’s offer form notes that the TB4+RA settlement should be settlement at SP15 hub. How should a developer respond if they are willing to offer a TB4+RA settlement contract type but at the interconnection node and not at the SP15 hub?

If a project intends to offer TB4 + RA at a hub other than SP15 please input “Yes, Hub Name” in the response form, and flag any additional details in the project narrative.
